Results from a recent clinical trial comparing patients with advanced melanoma receiving KEYTRUDA (68%; 188 of 277 patients) with those receiving ipilimumab (58%; 161 of 278 patients)

Because KEYTRUDA will not work for every patient, individual results may vary.

KEYTRUDA is a prescription medicine to treat a kind of skin cancer called melanoma. KEYTRUDA may be used when your melanoma has spread or cannot be removed by surgery (advanced melanoma). KEYTRUDA is usually given every 3 weeks through an intravenous (IV) line over 30 minutes.

KEYTRUDA is a type of treatment called immunotherapy. KEYTRUDA works with your body's immune system to help fight advanced melanoma. It is not known if KEYTRUDA is safe and effective in children less than 18 years of age.

Important Risk Information About KEYTRUDA

KEYTRUDA can cause your immune system to attack normal organs and tissues in many areas of your body and can affect the way they work. These problems can sometimes become serious or life-threatening and can lead to death.

Call or see your doctor right away if you develop any symptoms of the following problems or these symptoms get worse. Getting medical treatment right away may help keep these problems from becoming more serious.

Lung problems (pneumonitis). Symptoms of pneumonitis may include shortness of breath, chest pain, and new or worse cough.

Intestinal problems (colitis) that can lead to tears or holes in your intestine. Signs and symptoms of colitis may include diarrhea or more bowel movements than usual, stools that are black, tarry, sticky, or have blood or mucus; or severe stomach-area (abdomen) pain or tenderness.

Liver problems (hepatitis). Signs and symptoms of hepatitis may include yellowing of your skin or the

whites of your eyes, nausea or vomiting, pain on the right side of your stomach area (abdomen), dark urine, feeling less hungry than usual, or bleeding or bruising more easily than normal.

Hormone gland problems (especially the thyroid, pituitary, adrenal glands, and pancreas). Signs and symptoms that your hormone glands are not working properly may include rapid heart beat, weight loss or weight gain, increased sweating, feeling more hungry or thirsty, urinating more often than usual, hair loss, feeling cold, constipation, your voice gets deeper, muscle aches, dizziness or fainting, or headaches that will not go away or unusual headache.

Kidney problems, including nephritis and kidney failure. Signs of kidney problems may include a change in the amount or color of your urine.

Problems in other organs. Signs of these problems may include rash, changes in eyesight, severe or persistent muscle or joint pains, or severe muscle weakness, or low red blood cells (anemia).

Important Risk Information (continued)

Infusion (IV) reactions, that can sometimes be severe and life-threatening. Signs and symptoms of infusion reactions may include chills or shaking, shortness of breath or wheezing, itching or rash, flushing, dizziness, fever, or feeling like passing out.

Before you receive KEYTRUDA, tell your doctor if you have immune system problems such as Crohn's disease, ulcerative colitis, or lupus; have had an organ transplant; have lung or breathing problems; have liver problems; or have any other medical problems. If you are pregnant or plan to become pregnant, tell your doctor. KEYTRUDA can harm your unborn baby.

Tell your doctor about all the medicines you take.

The most common side effects of KEYTRUDA include feeling tired, cough, itching, decreased appetite, and shortness of breath.

These are not all the possible side effects of KEYTRUDA. Tell your doctor if you have any side effect that bothers you or that does not go away.
